#### **About our Program:**

- 24 months of clinical rotations: Urogynecology, Urology, Colorectal surgery/GI, and elective rotations
- 12 months of dedicated research time: 4 months year 1, 4 months year 2, 4 months year 3
- Elective opportunities: Global mission work, vulvovaginal disease clinic, cadaveric pelvic anatomy dissection
- Collaborative work environment where our fellows work closely with 2 FPMRS trained urologists, 3 ARNPs, 4 colorectal surgeons, and 4 pelvic floor physical therapists.
