

## Medical Center Downtown Unit Descriptions

<b>Telemetry</b>	27 bed unit cardiac monitored unit with the ability to monitor 14 more off unit pts, single occupancy rooms. Excellent unit to learn more about ECG rhythms and cardiac monitoring. Types of patients serviced: CHF, Afib, any patients with cardiac arrhythmias, also med/surg or ortho pts with cardiac needs.
<b>4C Surgical Unit</b>	4 Center is a 27-bed all private room, inpatient surgical floor. The majority of the patients we take care of are post operative orthopedic patients as well as post operative general surgery and urology patients. We do get medical overflow patients typically on the weekends since we do not have planned surgical cases on the weekends. We have a team comprised of nurses, patient care technicians, and nursing unit clerks to all assist in the care of our patients. Due to the orthopedic population, we also work very closely with physical and occupational therapy. The length of stay for patients is typically very short. Most patients discharge within 24 hours of their surgery.
<b>Intensive Care Unit</b>	The ICU at the downtown campus specializes in the care of the moderate to complex medical, surgical and cardiovascular diagnosis using a multidisciplinary collaborative team approach. The majority of our diagnosis include but not limited to respiratory failure, sepsis, DKA, CVA, CHF, AMI with PCI, AKI, ETOH withdrawal, overdose, recovery from general or orthopedic surgery. Intensive therapeutic modalities that include inotropic/vasoactive medications, mechanical ventilation, CRRT, IABP, Impella and transvenous pacemakers
<b>3W Medical</b>	3West is a 29-bed medical-neurology unit designated for general medicine, hospice, and stroke patient populations. Specific patient populations include, but not limited to – heart failure, neurological disorders, respiratory diseases, diabetes, pneumonia, asthma, multiple sclerosis, cancer, anemia, gastroenteritis, GI bleeding, renal failure, liver failure, appendicitis, thrombophlebitis, blood dyscrasias, alcohol withdrawal, respite care, and minimally invasive surgeries.
<b>Maternal Child</b>	<p><b>Labor and Delivery Unit - 3rd floor:</b> Newborns (28 days or less) and premature infants</p> <p><b>Pediatric Unit - 3rd floor:</b> Infants to young adults needing general medicine or surgical care</p> <p><b>Postpartum/Newborn/Gynecology Unit - 3rd floor:</b> Postpartum women, newborns, and post-gynecological</p>
