The Transplant Games of America (TGA) occur every other summer to bring together transplant recipients, living donors, donor families, caregivers, and transplant professionals from across the country. This year, TGA will be held in Birmingham, AL from July 5-10, 2024. The 2024 Transplant Games offers 20 different competitions and more than 60 special events. Some of the special events include the opening ceremonies, donor tribute, 5K run/walk, the TGA Village, and coffee houses. Recipients compete against each other in the 20 medal events, with donor families having the ability to compete in a few as well. What are the Transplant Games of America?

The Transplant Games of America are held as both a celebration of life and a way to honor the families of those who have given the gift of life through donation. The Transplant Games were established 33 years ago with the goal of raising awareness for organ, eye, and tissue donation and transplant. Teams at TGA

The Transplant Games of America are composed of state and international teams. Recipients and donors can participate a state team in two ways: the state where they currently reside or the state where their transplant or donation occurred. Team lowa is organized and sponsored by lowa Donor Network. For more information on Team lowa, click here.

The Team Cup Award is given to a team of ten or more competitors who have won the most medals per person during the week. Each medal has a point value, with the total number of medal points being divided by the number of team members.

How do I compete?

If you are a transplant recipient, all 20 events are open to compete in. There are two separate divisions for transplant recipients. Division 1 is for solid organ recipients. Division 2 is for living donors, tissue recipients, cornea recipients, and bone marrow recipients. There is also a division for donor families.

The competitions are separated by gender, with set age groups, and are either individual or team events. Competitors are limited to one individual event per day in addition to any team events they chose to participate in. There is no age restriction on who can compete.

There are a variety of activities to compete in-some athletic and some recreational. There are limitations on who can participate in each competition, so be sure to review the events for more information.

Medicare and Transplant

Medicare eligibility is based on age, disability, having end-stage kidney failure, or receiving a kidney transplant. No other organ transplant or need for organ transplant qualifies one for Medicare. There is a 1-year enrollment window for Medicare from date of kidney transplant. Delaying enrollment can increase chances of higher out-of-pocket expenses for anti-rejection medication. Medicare Advantage plans cover anti-rejection medications, and out-of-pocket expenses are subject to plan.
