## **Large Fitted Crib Sheet Instructions**

Patients in our Neonatal Intensive Care Unit can be here for an extended period of time and crib sheets are a great way to help the patient and their family feel more at home. Use our UI Health Care-specific NICU sheet patterns to get started. All sheets must be made using cotton fabrics. Bright and colorful patterns are highly recommended and preferred.

## **Supplies**

- 2 ¼ yards of 54-60" wide cotton-jersey or cotton-interlock fabric, or 2 1/3 yards of cotton print fabric
  - o Finished size ~ 60"x33"
  - o If using cotton-jersey or cotton-interlock fabric, it will shrink up to ½ yards when washed in hot water. This is why the pattern calls for extra fabric compared to cotton print fabric
- 3/8" or ½" elastic (~88" per sheet)

## Directions for a large, fitted crib sheet

- 1. Prewash the fabric in HOT water. Dry on high heat to ensure the fabric is preshrunk
- 2. Cut the fabric to be 47" wide and 74" long
- 3. Cut 7" squares out of each corner



- 4. Bring the two sides of the square together, placing the right sides together
- 5. Using a ¼" inseam, sew along the dashed lines in the picture above to form corner pockets. Make this seam strong by sewing along this line twice since it will take the most abuse
- 6. Serge or zigzag along the sewn seam to keep fabric from fraying
- 7. Serge the entire edge of the fabric. You can also turn the fabric under about 1/8" and sew
- 8. Hem the edge to accommodate the 3/8" or ½" elastic. Leave a small opening to insert the elastic
- 9. Using a large safety pin or bodkin, thread the elastic through the opening
- 10. Sew the elastic edges together and sew the opening closed

## Include a matching flat sheet with your donation!

- 1. Use one yard of the same material as your fitted sheet
- 2. Prewash the fabric in HOT water. Dry on high heat to ensure the fabric is preshrunk
- 3. Serge the whole piece or sew a very narrow hem
