Department of Emergency Medicine

The Department of Emergency Medicine serving UI Hospitals & Clinics and UI Stead Family Children's Hospital offers a state-of-the-art, 60,000-square-foot, 46-bed facility. It is the only Level 1 Trauma Center in Iowa providing care for the most critically ill adults and children in a patient- and family-centered environment. The department receives emergency cases from throughout Iowa and surrounding states.

The multidisciplinary service works closely with the medical and surgical departments at UI Hospitals & Clinics and UI Stead Family Children's Hospital.

Emergency Medicine includes approximately 30 faculty members with a range of expertise that covers EMS, disaster medicine, critical care, sports medicine, global health, pediatric emergency medicine, ultrasound, medical toxicology, medical education, simulation, and research.

The Department of Emergency Medicine provides medical direction to AirCare and the EMSLRC.
