#### **VAX FACTS**

#### Flu

Whether we like it or not, fall is here. Flu shots are highly recommended. We had a low incidence of influenza cases last year (believed to be the result of mask wearing and social distancing in addition to vaccination). This year, some of the restrictions have been removed. We anticipate an early flu season. Please consider getting your flu shot early this year. Not only will you have some protection against the flu, but this may also save you a COVID test since the symptoms are similar.

#### **COVID Boosters and Third Doses**

This information is constantly changing but at the time of the newsletter printing, there are two scenarios for which additional COVID vaccine doses are recommended:

One is for a <u>third dose</u> of Moderna or Pfizer vaccines in those people who have weakened immune systems and may not have had a full response to the traditional two-dose series. For patients living with HIV this has been defined as people who are not taking antiretroviral medications or who have a low CD4 count (<200). No recommendation for an additional dose has been made yet for those who have received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

In those without compromised immune systems (patients living with HIV who are well controlled on therapy), we assume a full immune response after initial vaccination that can decrease with time. In this case, a <u>booster shot</u> is recommended at a certain point (6 months) after the original vaccine series in order to boost your immune response. At this time booster shots are only approved for the following groups and only those who have received the Pfizer vaccine:

- 1. People aged 65 and older who reside in long-term care setting
- 2. People aged 50-64 (consider also in those aged 18-49) with underlying medical conditions such as kidney disease, diabetes, cancer, heart conditions, HIV, smoking, among others
- 3. People aged 18-64 who are increased risk of COVID exposure and transmission because of their occupation

At this time Pfizer is the only vaccine authorized for booster shots. We anticipate additional guidance for the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccines soon. Additionally, it's advised that you receive the same brand of vaccine booster or third dose as your original series.

#### Where to Get Your Vaccines!

**Flu**—Our Clinic (Medicine Specialty Clinic located on Level 3, Elevator L of the Pomerantz Family Pavilion) or your local pharmacy

**Pfizer COVID Vaccine**—Level 2 Pomerantz Pharmacy or check with your local pharmacy (bring your vaccine card if seeking 2nd shot)

**Pfizer COVID Booster**—Level 2 Pomerantz Pharmacy (bring COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card and you will need to attest to your immunocompromised status by completing a form) or check with your local pharmacy

\*\*\*Change from last year: We are no longer spacing COVID shots out from other vaccines.

They can be given at the same time as other vaccines.\*\*\*

#### **Insurance Happenings**

#### Medicare recipients who are case managed at UIHC or are not case managed:

Medicare clients who are case managed by UIHC or not case managed by any agency should have received a letter about Medicare's annual open enrollment period October 15 to December 7. During this time, you can review the 2022 Medicare prescription drug plans to determine whether your current plan is still the best plan for you next year, or whether you could save money by changing plans.

I can run your comparison and call you with the results. If your current plan is still the least expensive, I'll tell you that over the phone. If we find you can save money, I'll call you to set up a time when we can meet to go over the comparison with you. I will be able to start doing comparisons in early October and will do them on a first come-first served basis. You were mailed two forms regarding this enrollment. One is a release of liability and the other is to create an account to view the Part D comparisons. Please complete the forms and mail them back in the pre-paid envelope.

Important note: If you are covered by a Medicare Advantage plan and you receive notice this month that your plan will not be offered in 2021, please call and make an appointment so we can discuss the best option for you moving forward.



#### **PrEP**

PrEP is an important tool in the campaign to end the HIV epidemic. Please refer anyone in Iowa that you believe could benefit from PrEP. Iowa TelePrEP can help people with Medicare, Medicaid, private insurance and those who are uninsured get no or very low cost PrEP. #### Medica Premium Refund Letter:

We have received notice that clients who were on Medica in 2018 or 2019 have received letters about a premium refund for the plans from those years.

Medica is only able to make a certain amount of profit on Marketplace plans, and if they make too much they have to pay some of it back to the members for that year. They will be sending checks to all members. We do not know how much these checks will be, but because ADAP paid these premiums the check should be signed over to ADAP.

If you received a letter/check please sign the back of the check and write "for deposit by NuCara pharmacy only" and then give it to your case manager. If you have any questions please contact your case manager or field benefits specialist Angela Speers at 319-333-8714.

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is designed to assist low-income families with meeting the cost of home heating. Individuals/Families must meet income eligibility requirements to receive assistance through this program. Applications will be accepted on a first come/ first serve basis at your local Community Action Agency. Disabled and Elderly households can start to apply on October 1st, 2021. You may also apply on October 1, 2021 if you have a disconnection notice or your service is currently disconnected. All other eligible households may submit applications from November 1, 2021. You may be asked to provide documentation of three months' worth of income, your social security card, and copies of your heating/electric bills to accompany your application. Agencies may not be accepting in-person applications due to COVID-19. Please contact your local agency to determine the best way to complete an application. If you need help locating the agency responsible for LIHEAP in your county, please contact a member of our social work team.

#### **Our Clinic's COVID Vaccine Data**


The doctors, PAs and nurses at our clinic are united in recommending the COVID-19 vaccinations as the best way to protect yourself from the COVID-19 virus and its most severe symptoms, especially if you're immunocompromised. As a program, we are tracking of how many of our patients have followed these recommendations because we know that they represent your best chance of avoiding hospitalization or worse.

Currently, 61 percent of our active patients have reported receiving at least one dose of one of the available vaccines, and 55 percent have reported becoming fully vaccinated with two doses of the Moderna or Pfizer vaccines, or one dose of the Johnson & Johnson. 34 patients have even reported receiving a third booster dose of the Moderna or Pfizer versions.

We are encouraged by these numbers, but we suspect that there are even more of you out there who have gone to your local pharmacy or primary care provider and become fully vaccinated who haven't said anything yet. And we want to hear from you. Please reach out to tell your provider through MyChart or at your next visit if you've been vaccinated. And, if not, please let them know that you'd like to be. Vaccines are available at the UIHC every weekday from 8:30 AM to 5:30 pm. You don't even need an appointment. And our staff will be happy to help you find them.



Having trouble maintaining you housing due to an emergent situation such as job loss or illness? You may be eligible for HOPWA assistance. Please contact the HOPWA provider in your area to see if assistance is available. UIHC currently offers assistance with long-term rental assistance (TBRA), short-term rent, mortgage, and utility assistance (STRMU), and permanent housing placement services (PHP) (deposit and/ or 1st months rent).
