
Winter Emergency Shelter


25 Years at UIHC

I first learned about Ryan White when I was in grade school. Fast forward to the


late 90's and a graduate class peeked my interest about HIV and the services available. I gravitated towards the smaller AIDS Service Organizations in my initial search and landed my first job in Iowa City. I had the opportunity to work with the HIV Team at UIHC as I was helping clients that received care there. A social work/case manager position opened; I was both nervous and excited for the opportunity. I feel very fortunate that Dr. Stapleton and his team took a chance on this young graduate. I didn't know what to expect and I definitely didn't know I'd still be here 25 years later but what an adventure it's been. From the patients I've met to the colleagues I've worked with and those that mentored me early on, I feel incredibly grateful. Although there is still social stigma, there are many advances that make care and treatment more accessible for patients today. I am fortunate to be surrounded by such a dedicated team and am proud of our program. I am certain I won't be here in 25 more years so wanted to highlight some memories:

In addition to the annual Wellness Summit, PITCH also holds a virtual monthly meet and greet for PLWH and their support people. The meet and greets are divided into two sections, a group for those aged 18-34, and a group for those 35+ (although younger people are welcome to join this group). Those Living with HIV may also be eligible for a \$10 gift card to cover the cost of data used during the Zoom meetings. Rent Reimbursement

The Iowa Department of Health and Human Services will begin accepting applications for Rent Reimbursement claims for 2025. Low-income Iowans aged 65 or older or low income disabled

adults may be eligible for partial reimbursement of rent paid up to \$1,000. You can apply online at https://benefits.stateofiowahhs.org/program/rentreimbursement or call LifeLong Links: Iowa's Aging and Disability Resource Center for assistance at 1-866-468-7887. You will need to be able to provide verification of identity, disability, income, and rent paid. Iowa Rent reimbursement claims for 2024 can be filed until December 31, 2026. Rent reimbursement claims for 2023 can be filed until December 31, 2025.






A reminder that applications for LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program) are being accepted now through April 30, 2025 for households under 200% of the 2024 federal poverty guidelines. Eligible households will have a lump sum payment made directly to their account with the utility company responsible for their heat. Contact your local community action outreach office to apply. Important Insurance Reminders

In order to maintain continuity in case management and medical care it is imperative that you provide your case manager with the following documents that you may be receiving updated copies of:

- Insurance Premium Statement (bill) •
- **Insurance** Cards
- Social Security Benefits Letter

You can send these documents to your case manager via text, email, mail, or bring your letters and cards with you to your next appointment. Medicare Part D, Medicare Supplement, ADAP sponsored insurance (ASI), and/or your employer sponsored insurance often provide updated benefit information through the mail. Please contact your case manager or our interim Field Benefits Specialist, Malory Dreasler (319-356-1545) if you have insurance questions or concerns.

HOPWA

(Housing Opportunity for People with AIDS)

Are you in need of financial assistance to get or maintain housing? You may be eligible for services provided by HOPWA such as Long-Term Rental Assistance, Short-Term Rent, Mortgage and Utility Assistance, or Permanent Housing Placement. Eligibility is based on your income (limits vary by county), emergency status, and Ryan White case management status. Clients case managed at UIHC may talk to their case manager to complete a referral form that will be forwarded to the HOPWA coordinator Viri Estudillo Areguin.
